### Bulus Bossan / Kenya & Nigeria



Bulus was the Nigerian country leader for Nav ministries from 1994-2004. In 2003, he became a member of the Africa

Regional Team responsible for missions and English speaking countries of Eastern Africa. In 2011, he was selected to lead Nav ministries in 28 countries of Sub-Saharan Africa. Bulus and Salama have four daughters from 18 to 26.

### Mvula Mvula / Malawi



Mvula holds a Masters Degree in Contemporary Missions from Redcliffe College in the U.K. (2008). He has a passion for creating

discipleship-focused churches. He is a member of the ARC responsible for enhancing the ministry to oral learners and the non-literate throughout Sub Saharan Africa. Mvula and his wife Esther have three sons and three daughters from 22 to 38.

**Orality: Reaching and Discipling the Non-literate /** The majority of the world prefers oral methods of communication. This is especially true of non-literate African countries. ### Sarah Mutua / Kenya



In 1978, Sarah was the first full time Navigator staff woman in Kenya. She served 22 years in high school ministry as well as the

Kenya National Leadership Team before joining her husband in student ministry. After her husband's death, Sarah rejoined Navigator staff to represent the interests of women on the ARC. Sarah has two sons 19 and 22.

**Ministering to Women in Africa /** Sarah will share her story and the story of other African women. She will give us a biblical example and explain the role of faith as we seek to minister to the women of Africa.

### Okorie Kalu / Nigeria



Okorie and Chi served as missionaries to Zambia from 1994-2002. The Kalus then joined the Africa Regional Team and Okorie served as

the Africa Director for Missions and the leader for English West Africa zone. Okorie and Chi have two daughters and one son from 18 to 28.

**Message #1: Poverty, Corruption, & Injustice /** Poverty, corruption, and injustice dehumanize people and destroy society. Responding biblically delights God, destroys the works of Satan, and delivers the dividends of redemption to a poverty-stricken world.

**Message #2: Living Close to Those with a Different Faith /** Workers for the Kingdom are next door to everywhere! How should we respond to those who hate us?
